### Travelling to and from school

Unfortunately, I have had two neighbours contact the school this week regarding the way in which children are travelling to and from school. Our first neighbour had a collision with a child on a bike (not the driver's fault). Fortunately the child was unhurt, but was riding a bike which was too big for him, and was not wearing a helmet. All parents are reminded that helmets **MUST** be worn by cyclists.

Our second neighbour was really quite cross about the way in which parents are parking and driving down Main Road, having experienced two near misses with parents pulling out in front of her without indicating or exercising due care and attention. I am so embarrassed by this as I can not count the number of times I have had to write messages about safety or speak to individual parents. This week, I have also witnessed parents stopping on the yellow zig zag lines in front of school.

You all have a duty and responsibility to act safely around the school, its children, other pedestrians and motorists. You also have a duty to set a positive example to your children, which some of you simply are not doing. You are also bringing our school into disrepute—we have a good reputation but this is being damaged by your actions. One of these days, someone is going to get hurt, and I hope to God it isn't one of our children. Please use your common sense. Or even better, with this great weather, use your feet and walk part or all of your journey to school.

It seems that part of the problem is that you are now parking on both sides of the road, which creates blockages and bottle necks. Please could we all use some common sense and only park on one side of the road, (school side) so that traffic can still move fairly freely down Main Road.

I have and will continue to advise any of our neighbours who are inconvenienced by the very small number of inconsiderate parents to report incidences to the police.

I know most of you drive safely, carefully and considerately—**thank you for this, it is greatly appreciated.**
