At the moment, we're not sure if we will return to face to face meetings next year, but we will continue to use this system for booking appointments and, where necessary, for virtual appointments. One of the benefits of this system is that it did keep everyone to time, so no parents were left waiting long after their booked slot.

Next week is busy, so please check the timetable of events later on in the newsletter. On Thursday, our last day, children may wear their own clothes. We have booked some 'fun stuff' for them to enjoy as a 'well done' for coping so brilliantly with the challenges we've all faced this year. One of the surprises (please keep this a secret!) is an ice cream van—every child will be able to visit the van and have an ice cream—there is non dairy ice cream for those children will dairy intolerances/allergies. COVID Update

Late yesterday, the DfE published further guidance for schools regarding Step 4 of the COVID roadmap, giving us little time to fully consider the implications.

From Monday, we will continue with the measures which have been in place this year:

- Please continue to wear masks when on school site and maintain your distance from others
- Please do not visit the school unless you have an appointment—please phone through requests for staff
- The one way system will continue to operate as will the 'kiss and go' approach to drop off in the mornings
- Staggered timings will continue—please follow these
- Please do not gather in large groups outside the school entrances/exits
- We will continue to keep classes separate

We would like to return to 'normal' in September, however, we need to be realistic and accept that, based on the current situation and appreciating that cases will rise once Step 4 is implemented, it is likely that there will have to be continued measures to keep people safe. I will spend time on this towards the end of the summer holidays when we have a picture of what the wider situation is like, but I am expecting that we will continue to operate the one way system, restrict numbers of parents on site/face to face meetings, and social distancing/mask wearing. I will write to you early in September with full details.

From Monday:

- If there is a positive case in school, children will no longer be asked to isolate straightaway; decisions regarding isolation will sit with the NHS Track and Trace system—the school will no longer have a track and trace responsibility
- If a pupil tests positive, parents will be contacted by NHS Track & Trace and asked about their child's close contacts
- People, which may include classmates, who need to isolate will be contacted by NHS Track and Trace.
- Anyone who tests positive will still need to isolate—you must inform the school if your child tests positive and you must keep them away from school
- Please continue to keep children at home and arrange a PCR test if they shown any of the 3 main symptoms of COVID, and any of the lesser symptoms
- Schools may be contacted by NHS Track and Trace to help with identifying/contacting close contacts—we may be required to share your contact details in this situation.
- From 16th August, children will no longer be required to self-isolate if they are contacted by NHS Track and Trace; between Monday and 16th August, however, self isolation rules for children continue.
- We will upload some documents onto the school website which give further information regarding contact tracing https://www.stjamesvalower.org.uk/information/covid-19

If in doubt, contact us and we will try and help or contact the NHS directly.

Please remember that, if we have positive cases next week, it is likely that some people will have to isolate during the first weeks of their summer holiday, so please, let's make sure we are not the reason for causing anyone a disrupted start to their holiday!
