# Newsletter 10th September, 2021

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What a wonderful week we've had! It's been lovely to welcome all the children back to school and we have so enjoyed getting back to our normal routines—having assembly together as a school family has been a particular treat!

We do still need to be cautious, however, and stay alert to the possibility of COVID transmission. To this end, we're still asking children to wash/sanitise their hands regularly throughout the day. Bedford Borough have also provided us with CO2 monitors for each classroom, which allows us to monitor air quality within the classrooms, and increase ventilation (ie open windows) where necessary.

Thank you to all of you who continue to wear your face coverings whilst on the school site; whilst not a legal requirement, doing so just adds an extra layer of protection for us all and may help to limit any transmission—it certainly can't do any harm, can it? We will continue using the one way system in the mornings and at pick up; if you visit the office at these times, please exit the school via the pedestrian gate rather than coming back down the drive, thank you.

Please remember to keep children at home if they are showing any of the 3 main symptoms or any of the lesser symptoms, or are in any way unwell. It is likely that we will see cases of other types of infectious illnesses increase over the next few months, such as the winter vomiting bug, so we need to be alert to any early signs of this so we can avoid outbreaks. If we have any concerns regarding your child's health, even if we're not sure, we will isolate them from other children, and contact you to come and collect them from school.

The local public health team have set thresholds for determining what is meant by an outbreak, and these are quite low. If an outbreak is determined, then we have a plan which outlines the actions we will take. Essentially, we will have to return to the restrictions we had in place last year—separate class bubbles, limits to parents and visitors coming into school, the return of face coverings etc. None of us want to return to this so please work with us to keep potential transmission to a minimum. Thank you!

Sadly, Mrs Doughty remains unwell, and is likely to be away from school for some time. We have secured the services of Mr Chris Craigen to work in our Robins class. Chris is an experienced teacher who has spent the last few years working in British schools in Malaysia. He has been in school today getting to grips with the way we work here, and will be here on Monday to welcome our new Robins on their first day of school. We've also welcomed other new staff this week—Mrs Alyssa DeLuca is our Year 4 teacher working alongside Mrs Corby, and Mrs Kate Spratt is our new LSA, also working in Year 4. I know you will all welcome our new colleagues and will give them your support and encouragement as they settle into our school family.

I have included some dates for your diaries for the next few weeks, and in next week's newsletter will include all the planned dates for the year ahead. Curriculum News Information for classes will be sent home on Monday—on PE days, children should continue to wear their PE kit into school. Please ensure, however, that your child is wearing the correct PE kit (ie royal blue t-shirt), and appropriate trainers.

As is so often the case, the sun returns when children return to school! I hope we can all enjoy some sunshine/ warmth over the weekend—rest well and we'll see you all back on Monday,

#### Support for families includes:

- providing information and signposting to services who can provide further support
- liaising with a range of external services such as housing and Social Care
- assistance in completing paperwork and forms e.g. housing, special educational needs, school places and benefits
- attendance and support at school and other agency meetings
- families who require food bank vouchers
- family stresses
- Bereavement
- Changes in circumstances
- families in crisis
- practical advice and support in promoting positive behaviour at home
- guidance with career and personal development and access to training and workshops in school and other agencies
